

The scriptures are completely silent for an 18-year period (12-30) Except for this short story that climaxes with the statement that Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man.

Why did Luke include this passage? Jesus had to work at His own identity - Result is a model worth following that even at a young age he was devoted to His Fathers business.

Help us appreciate his humanity?

In a broad outline, but in one succinct sentence, Luke gives us the four major fields of man's activity/striving - mental, physical, spiritual, and social.

Wisdom - Mental Stature - Physical Favour with God - Spiritual Favour with Man - Social

All are important. Each occupies an important place in a man's advancement toward maturity

Growing in Wisdom

Blessed is the one who finds wisdom, and the one who gets understanding, for the gain from her is better than gain from silver and her profit better than gold. She is more precious than jewels, and nothing you desire can compare with her. Long life is in her right hand; in her left hand are riches and honour. Her ways are ways of pleasantness, and all her paths are peace. Proverbs 3:13-18

And the boy Samuel continued to grow in stature and in favour with the LORD and with people. 1 Samuel 2:26

In part it relates to Physical growth - Transition adolescence/manhood In part it relates to Character growth - Reputation for integrity

Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God -this is your true and proper worship. Romans 12:1

Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honour God with your bodies. 1 Corinthians 6:19-20

Growing in Favour with God

Jesus grew spiritually. We know this because Luke includes this story to demonstrate that even in an adolescent mind, Jesus grasped the importance (with the emerging wisdom that he had) that positioning himself in the Temple was where he would grow.

- We know that his priority was His Fathers business.
- We know Jesus did only what the Father instructed.
- We see the pattern of Jesus practicing the principles of favour.
- We see Jesus expressing the highest commitment to relationship with the Father

REPUTATION - How easy is it for one character flaw to unravel our name: The Challenge is to Grow in Maturity

He must also have a good reputation with outsiders, so that he will not fainto disgrace and into the devil's trap. 1 Timothy 3:7

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples. John: 15 1-8

My Fathers Business

Christmas/New Year is a great time to reassess priorities Ensure our time is not wasted on things that don't count for eternity

But each one should build their life with great care. For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ. If anyone builds on this foundation using gold, silver, costly stones, wood, hay or straw, their work will be shown for what it is, because the Day will bring it to light. It will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test the quality of each person's work. If what has been built survives, the builder will receive a reward. If it is burned up, the builder will suffer loss but yet will be saved - even though only as one escaping through the flames.

In the midst of the Passover celebration, the festive journey; in the midst of everyday life drama's – Jesus reminds us that nothing is more important than being about our Fathers business.

What has God called us to do to advance His Kingdom? How well are we fulfilling that calling? What is the ministry, the specific task or role, the part in His expansion plan for which God has put you on this Earth to fulfil?

We must not slip away (like Mary and Joseph did) from remembering that life's meaning will boil down to the investment we made in the Kingdom – Pursuing the Fathers business.
