When did Paul write Romans?



On Paul's 3rd missionary journey while in Corinth he wrote Romans.

Why did Paul write Romans ?

Romans 1:8-13

First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is being reported all over the world. ⁹ God, whom I serve in my spirit in preaching the gospel of his Son, is my witness how constantly I remember you ¹⁰ in my prayers at all times; and I pray that now at last by God's will the way may be opened for me to come to you.

¹¹ I long to see you so that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to make you strong— ¹² that is, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith. ¹³ I do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, that I planned many times to come to you (but have been prevented from doing so until now) in order that I might have a harvest among you, just as I have had among the other Gentiles.

Why did Paul write Romans ?

To let them know he longs to visit so they may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith.

To make sure the church in Rome knows what he believes about the gospel before he visits.

The book of Romans

CHAPTERS: 16 VERSES: 433

The longest single letter
Paul wrote.

The book was written to Jewish
Christians and Gentile Christians .

Romans 15:23-25

²³ But now that there is no more place for me to work in these regions, and since I have been longing for many years to visit you, ²⁴ I plan to do so when I go to Spain. I hope to see you while passing through and to have you assist me on my journey there, after I have enjoyed your company for a while. ²⁵ Now, however, I am on my way to Jerusalem in the service of the Lord's people there.

¹⁶When we got to Rome, Paul was allowed to live by himself, with a soldier to guard him.
