# Four Perspectives...

The WORLD says...

- Find people that make you happy
- Invest in winners
- Just put them in the too hard basket
- **CONCLUSION:** Don't bother!

GOD says...

- My mission is to the sick (Mark 2:17)
- I've chosen the foolish and weak things of the world to shame the wise and strong. (1 Corinthians 1:27)
- I am God, nothing is too hard for me (Jeremiah 32:27)

# Four Perspectives...

### SELF says...

- I know they're in the wrong and I am justified to feel annoyed.
- How long will it take for them to get it!?
- I just want to slap some sense into them!
- I need to get it off my chest, so I'll share my frustration with anyone who will listen (and hopefully they affirm my thinking)

### **CONCLUSION:** I'm better than they are.

GOD says...

- Do not criticise or judge each other (Matt 7:1-5, James 11-12)
- God will complete what He's started (Philippians 1:6)
- Put away anger and slander (Colossians 3:7-8)
- Be patient, not grumbling against one another (James 5:7-11)
- Speak the truth in love (Ephesians 4:14-15)
- Be humble, not self-righteous (Matt 23:23-24, Hebrews 3:13, Philippians 2:3)
- Remember your old ways, and who saved you (Titus 3:1-7)
- Help your brother or sister (James 5:19-20)

# Four Perspectives...

### The ENEMY says...


- They're not going to change
- It's ok to feel discouraged and disheartened
- You should withdraw to protect yourself
- Life is better (healthier/more free/fruitful etc) without them

#### **CONCLUSION:**

There is no hope here.

GOD says...

- God used "the chief sinner" (Paul) as a prime example of His great patience (1 Timothy 1:15-16)
- Rejoice in the Lord always! Think about praiseworthy things! (Philippians 4:4-8)
- Don't isolate yourself (Proverbs 18:1, Ecclesiastes 4:12, Hebrews 10:24-25)
- The strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak (Romans 15:1)
- The Holy Spirit fills us with hope (Romans 15:13)
- God will complete what He's started (Philippians 1:6)



Our response as Jesus followers...

- Model (right living)
- Pray
- Respond biblically in love (encourage, promote unity, teach, exhort)
